## **Press Release**

Gallatin County COVID-19 Update

As of Wednesday, May 6, 2020, at 12 p.m. Gallatin County has no new confirmed cases of COVID-19, for a cumulative total of 146. There are zero confirmed active cases. There have been a total of 145 people recovered and 2,439 people tested in Gallatin County. One person has died from COVID-19 complications.

The Gallatin City-County Health Department calculates the **recovered case number** as the number of total cases minus any active cases, current hospitalizations and deaths.
